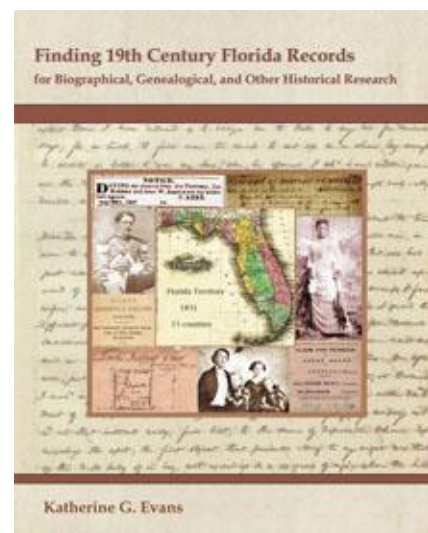

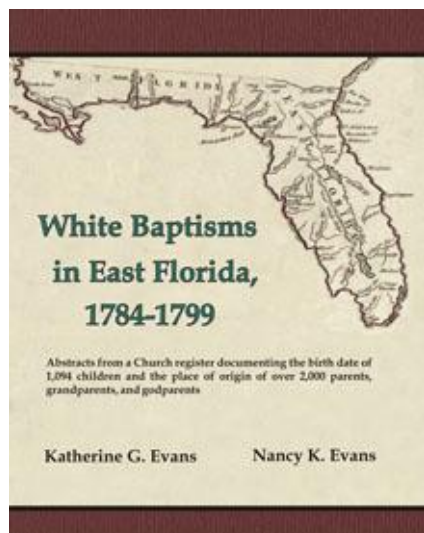

Each entry was translated from Spanish into English and abstracted by the Historical Records Survey of the Work Progress Administration between 1939 and 1941. Maps and tables have been created to link the 18th century place names with their modern locations.

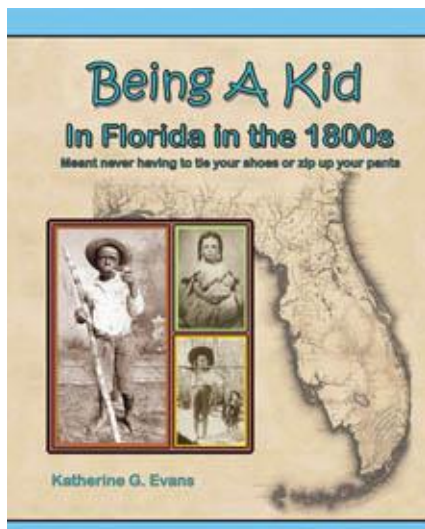

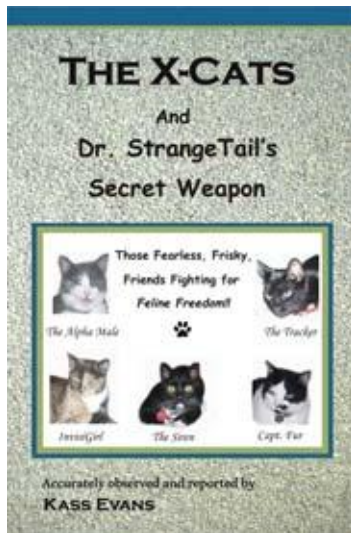
